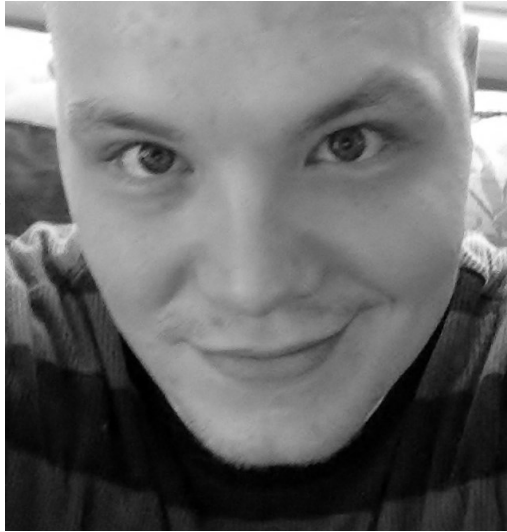
A Note from Founder “Odd” Bob Markin...

ROCK PARANORMAL STARTS NEW "GOFUNDME" FUNDRAISER PROGRAM

Over the years, Rock Paranormal has had it's ups and downs when it comes to finances, mostly because the entire operation depends on one person to fund all of it's activities (me). The problem is, although I don't mind paying for the website hosting and to contribute when the rest of the team wants to partake in an investigation, I'm not Richie Rich, and I can't support and pay for the entire team all of the time.

People always want to go ghost hunting and visit all of these famous places, but no one ever wants to actually pay anything out of pocket for it. I've tried different ways of raising money, including charging a membership fee of \$5 per month (but no one wanted to pay it), tried getting the team to come up with fundraising ideas/activities we could do (but again to no avail), and more. That's when I decided to open the OddBob stores as a way to help me raise funds to cover the costs associated with running our organization. However, I haven't been having much luck on that front, either.

So, I sat down one day with Google and tried finding some ways to raise funds. I've come up with two solutions: one) Yankee Candle Fundraiser (still in the works), and two) A GoFundMe Campaign.

I created the GoFundMe Campaign with a goal of raising a few thousand dollars to help cover current and future costs of the group's operation. The money raised would be used to purchase some much-needed new/upgraded equipment, renew certain magazine/periodical subscriptions, and the rest would be pooled into a Petty Cash fund to be used to fund future investigation trips that we have

planned, including a visit to Starved Rock State Park, Bachelor's Grove Cemetery, and an overnight investigation at the infamous Waverly Hills Sanatorium. Anything that remains would be used for group-related expenses, only.

This GoFundMe campaign will run along side any other fundraisers we will be implementing over the next few months. The Odd Bob Stores will also be getting their official "Grand Opening" sometime before January 2017, which will also help to cover continued operating costs.

HAUNTS AND SIGHTINGS FROM CHICAGO, THE MIDWEST AND BEYOND...

THE FLIGHT 191 DISASTER

Chicago, Illinois

One of the worst disasters in airline history occurred right here in Chicago at the O'Hare Airport, Memorial Day weekend in 1979.

Flight 191, with over 270 passengers and crew on board, were set to leave Chicago O'Hare on a non-stop flight to Los Angeles, CA on Friday, May 25, 1979. Fueled, passengers loaded, and crew ready for the journey ahead, the plane, an American Airlines McDonnell-Douglas DC-10.

The state-of-the-art aircraft and highly experienced crew were no match for fate.

Just before three in the afternoon, the airplane began to taxi to the runway for takeoff. As the plane made it's way down the runway, one of the tower controllers noticed that port (left-side) pylon which supported the engine appeared to be "falling off", and also reported that a white vapor-like smoke was coming from the damaged area.

Before the pilot could instruct the plane, it began to take off. No sooner than the plane had cleared the ground, the damaged engine broke off of the plane and came crashing down into the runway.

The tower controller attempted to contact the plane and get them to land for repairs before the

situation escalated, but in mere seconds, the plane banked and plunged into the ground below in an explosion of fire and raining debris.

Thankfully, the craft crashed into an abandoned hangar on the site of the abandoned Ravenswood Airport, just to the east of a mobile home park. However, although the plane didn't crash into any other buildings, it still managed to kill two bystanders on the ground, and debris damaged several nearby buildings, including homes in the mobile home park. All 271 passengers and crew of Flight 191 were killed instantly upon crashing.

Faulty parts and lack of proper maintenance were cited as the causes of the crash.

However, within a few months of the crash, motorists began reported strange sightings near the site where the incident occurred. Strange lights with no earth-bound sources were seen by multiple witnesses on multiple occasions. But, it gets even stranger...

Just moments after the crash, residents of the nearby mobile home park began hearing knocks and raps at their doors and windows, only for homeowners to open their doors to empty air. Animals in the park also reacted wildly, and dogs would bark incessantly at the field where the crash occurred.

This phenomenon continued to escalate for weeks following the disaster. Residents of the park, including former police officers and firefighters, also reported the strange phenomenon. Doorknobs were reported to be turned and played with, and often times footsteps could be heard as if someone were approaching. There were even reports of certain witnesses... CONTINUED NEXT PAGE ➡

... (Flight 191 Continued) that they had seen actual human-like figures. Some persons even encountered apparitions so life-like that they believed they were talking with a real person. These figures would sometimes claim to be “looking for their luggage”, but always ended up disappearing into thin air at some point shortly after being encountered.

The strange events caused several of the mobile home park's residents to uproot and move, but new tenants continued to report similar strange phenomenon, with some reporting continued related phenomenon to this day.

It is also reported that one of the ghosts haunts the O'Hare Terminal itself. There have been multiple reports of a man having been seen using a telephone booth which is located near the departure gate that was used by Flight 191 on that fateful day. He appears in what has been described as “outdated clothing”, and appears to step away from the telephone booth, take a few steps towards the gate, and then vanishes without a trace.

THE GHOSTS OF ROBINSON WOODS

Chicago, Illinois

Andrew Robinson was the son of a Scottish trader and an Ottawa Indian woman. His family were some of the earliest influential leaders of the city. He survived the Fort Dearborn Massacre and the War of 1812, and was credited with saving numerous lives.

Robinson eventually acquired the land the park now sits on through his dealings with the city and then local Indian Tribe for his services during and after the War. Over the years, he sold off bits and pieces of the land to arriving settlers. They had built a large house on the land, which sat back in the woods, and had “wild parties” for guests. How-

ever, in 1955, the house burned to the ground. Shortly after the fire, the bodies of three men were found naked, bound and tossed in a ditch on the property. The murders remained unsolved for over forty years.

Some of the family remained on the property after the grisly discovery, up until construction of the new O'Hare Airport when the land was annexed by the city as a connection between the two places.

Many of the family are buried on the land, now called Robinson Woods, which is located just off of Lawrence Avenue. Strange events have been reported for many years, including sightings of apparitions that appear to be Native Americans, odd lights dancing through the trees, and even strange sounds like voices and beating drums have been reported by multiple witnesses over the years. The area has been investigated multiple times by the *Ghost Research Society* of Chicago, and they managed to capture several audio EVPs that sound like native drum beats and chopping wood.

Inside the woods, you will find a large stone marker that denotes the grave of the Robinsons.

PARANORMAL 101:

Hans Holzer, Father of Paranormal Research

Hans Holzer is one of the most famous paranormal researchers on this planet, next to Ed & Lorraine Warren. Born in Austria in January 1920, during his career he authored over a hundred books on the paranormal and the occult, including various plays, films, documentaries, and even hosted a television shows entitled “Ghost Hunter” (not the current “Ghost Hunters” we see on television today).

Before becoming an infamous ghost hunter, Holzer studied archaeology and ancient history at the University of Vienna. In 1938, his family immigrated to New York City, where he continued his studies in psychology. He earned a parapsychology degree from a school in London called the College of Applied Science, and later taught parapsychology courses at the New York Institute of Technology.

Some of his most famous cases include “The Amityville Horror” case, which he authored a few books about. During his investigations into the Amityville case, he brought one of his trusted mediums to the site. This medium claimed the building was built over ancient Indian burial grounds, and that the spirit that possessed Ronald DeFeo, Jr. to kill his family was actually that of a Native American Chief. It was later found that there are innumerable ancient native American burial sites littered all throughout

Amityville, adding validity to his claims.

He is also credited for coining the term “the other side”, even though the term was used by Spiritualists decades before. He often worked with famous trans-mediums such as Ethel Johnson-Meyers, Sybil Leek, and the like.

One of the problems with Holzer’s investigations was that he relied on the use of psychics and mediums to gather his data rather than scientific instruments. He was widely criticized, mostly because scientists felt that his claims had to “basis in scientific reality”, and that the use of psychics cast doubt on the validity of his work, as it had

no “real world” evidence to substantiate his claims.

He married the Countess Catherine Genevieve Buxhoeveden in 1962, and had two daughters with the countess, Alexandra and Nadine. Alexandra grew up hearing and reveling in her father’s tales of supernatural spirits and earth-bound entities every day of her life.

In April 2009, at the age of 89, Dr. Holzer passed to the “other side”. His legacy includes over 138 books, many of which are renowned throughout the paranormal research community, and all of his various other works.

His daughter, Alexandra, has picked up where her father left off, and continues to study and research the paranormal phenomenon to this day in his honor. (You can visit her website and read about her research at: <http://www.alexandraholzer.com/>)

Holzer investigated many infamous locations, including the Octagon House, and many private locations, as revealed in his many books. If you'd like to read some of his books, I recommend the titles below (all books authored by Hans Holzer):

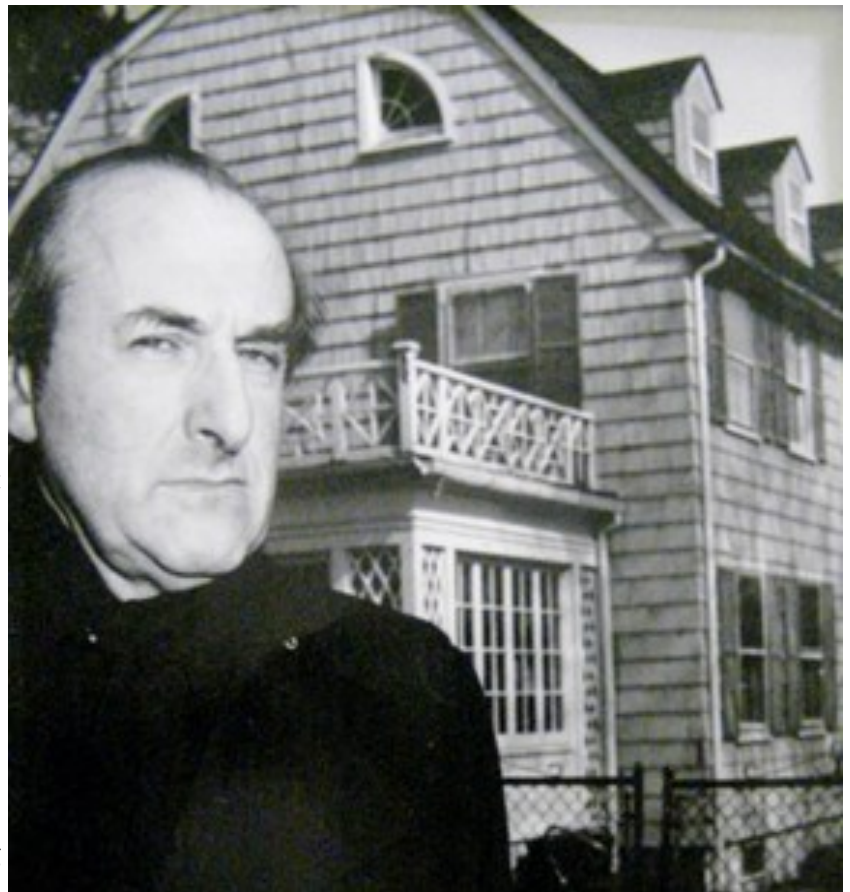

THE LIZZIE BORDEN BED AND BREAKFAST

Everyone knows the infamous lyrics:

“Lizzie Borden took an axe,

And gave her mother forty whacks.

When she saw what she had done,

She gave her father forty-one.”

In 1892, Mr. Andrew Jackson Borden and his wife, Abby Durfee Gray Borden, were found murdered in their luxurious home in Fall River, Massachusetts. Still to this day, speculation continues as to what really happened that fateful August evening at 92 Second Street (changed to 230 Second Street after 1896, according to the Wiki files).

Sometime between the hours of 9 and 10:30 in the morning, Mrs. Borden was cleaning one of the guest rooms after a family friend had stayed over the night before. During her cleaning, she was apparently struck over the head with a hatchet, which caused her to fall to the floor. Her killer then sat on her back and delivered an additional nineteen blows directly to the back of her head.

Shortly after, somewhere between 10:30 and 11 a.m., while taking a peaceful early-morning nap on a sofa in the living area, Mr. Borden was killed with the same type of weapon, suffering anywhere between 10-12 blows to the head, one which caused one of his eyeballs to split cleanly into two pieces.

Just before 11:10 a.m., the family’s live-in

maid, known to be called “Maggie” by Lizzie after a former housekeeper, was summoned by Lizzie who was calling to her saying that her father was dead and had been killed.

Police were called and arrived a short time later. During the investigation, police found that Lizzie’s answers to their questions were most often strange and contradictory, or changed entirely from what she had previously told them. She gave two different accounts of what happened before she found her father’s body, one stating that she had been outside in the barn eating pears (but no evidence was found that anyone had been in the barn at all that day), and the other that she was outside and heard strange noises coming from the house, only to find her murdered parents upon entering the home.

Many of the officers reported that Lizzie seemed “calm and poised” during questioning, not at all like someone who just lost their family should act. Despite many investigators noting that something was “off” about Lizzie, no one bothered to check her for signs of blood spatter or any other forensic evidence that might connect her to the murders.

Upon searching the house, police found two hatchets, two axes and a hatchet-head with a broken handle. It was assumed that the broken hatchet, which appeared... CONTINUED...

... to have been recently broken (possibly during the attacks) also appeared to have been deliberately covered in dust and soot to make it appear that the hatchet had been in the basement for a long time. However, none of the items were ever removed from the house.

Later that evening, after the initial investigation had been completed, an officer reported seeing Lizzie looking at her parent's bloodied clothing. Later, after she was informed that she was a primary suspect, she was later seen burning a dress in a fire. She told everyone that the dress was covered in paint and couldn't be saved, so she "got rid of it". It was later revealed that the dress she burned was the dress she was wearing on the day of the murders.

During her trial, the judge slammed the police and investigators for failing to give proper "due diligence" to the case (referring to their failure to collect evidence and examine Lizzie). Much of the evidence brought to trial was dismissed, and eventually, Lizzie was acquitted of the murders.

Lizzie stayed in River Falls until her death in 1927 from pneumonia. Since her death, the home changed hands and eventually came under the current owners, who turned it into a Bed & Breakfast. For around \$200+ per night, you can stay in the actual rooms where the murders took place, participate in tours and ghost hunts on the property, and

if you survive the night, can enjoy a delicious home-cooked meal the next morning.

Since the home opened as an Inn, people

have reported all types of strange phenomenon occurring, including reports of the sounds of a weeping woman, the sight of a Victorian-dressed woman dusting furniture and straightening bed covers (sometimes while the guests are still in bed!), doors and windows opening and closing on their own, sounds of

footsteps coming from empty hallways, and even muffled conversations and voices have been heard by various guests of the Inn. Even the owners have had their fair share of paranormal experiences over the years.

If you are in the Massachusetts area, and are looking for something supernatural to do, stop in and stay a night at the Lizzie Borden Bed & Breakfast... hopefully, it won't be your last...

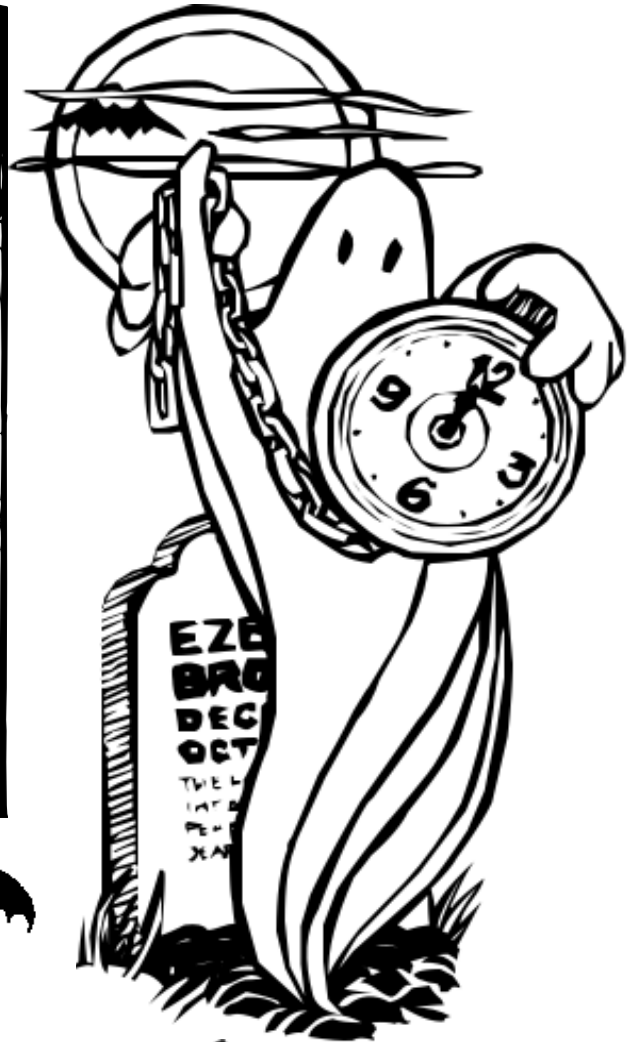

Ghost-Hunting in Cemeteries for Halloween

Every fall, cemeteries and abandoned buildings around the country are sought out and visited by droves of people looking to be scared by something supernatural for the Halloween Season. Many times, unfortunately, these visitors end up bringing a party with them, and damage and destruction often run rampant during the season. I've personally seen many beautiful cemeteries left in utter chaos after partying teenagers leave their garbage or destroy monuments and markers with graffiti or just plain desecration and destruction.

Although I encourage everyone to do what makes them happy, including visiting places such as these, it is important to remember that these places are often sacred, and more often than not the final resting places of someone's loved ones. How would you feel if you went to your grandmother's grave and found that someone had spray-painted a jack-o-lantern or something offensive across it? And that they kicked over her flower pot and threw the bricks left by previous family members throughout the graveyard? I can only imagine how mad you would be. Well, when you do that to someone else's family, they feel the exact same way.

I know that not everyone will heed this advice, nor do they care. They simply want to get out and be scared. Fair enough. Just remember to respect the places you visit. Your actions may anger any lingering spirits, and they may follow you home and wreck havoc on your life. Or, you can end up being caught trespassing after hours by the local authorities, and end up sitting the night in jail or having to pay a hefty fine.

In either even, people are still going to flock to these locations anyway, so here are a few hints to keep your ghost hunting safe:

1. Visit the site during the day before you visit at night, and map out any potential dangers. This will come in handy when you come back and it's so dark you can't see a foot in front of your face. You'll know where those low-lying markers or the newly dug grave are located, and won't trip and fall.
2. Never go alone! Always bring someone with you, and tell someone else where you will be going that is not party to the adventure. That way, if something does happen, someone will know where to look for you.
3. Always bring a flashlight and a first aid kit! You'll need to be able to see (even just somewhat) where you are going. In case of injury (which happens quite often in my experience, especially when you visit unfamiliar places) can help keep wounds from getting infected. Plus, if you can patch yourself up, you can continue investigating without having to leave to go find a band-aide.

With these few things in mind, you can practice safer Cemetery Ghost Hunts on Halloween. Although, if you are indeed looking to be scared, the Haunted Houses and Hayrides in your city may be more apt to doing the job than an old cemetery.

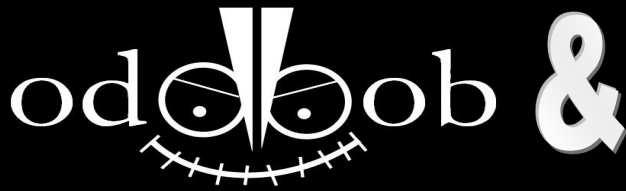

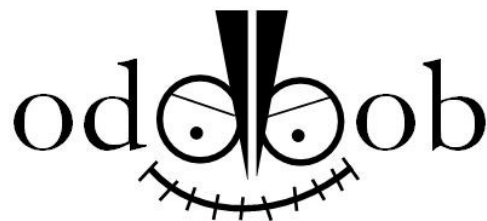
